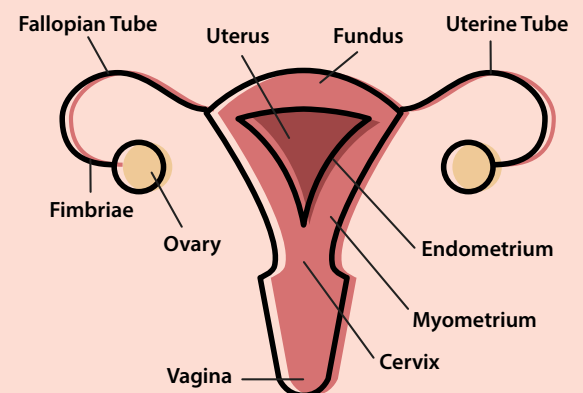

Know the Symptoms of Uterine Cancer

Uterine cancer is the most common gynecologic cancer in the U.S. and may also be referred to as endometrial cancer.



Symptoms include:

- Heavier periods than normal
- Bleeding between periods or after menopause
- Abnormal pelvic pain or discomfort

Uterine cancer is not tested for during routine exams (such as Pap smears).

If you have symptoms, VA can provide tests, such as a biopsy or ultrasound, to detect or rule out cancer.

EARLY DETECTION MATTERS

Uterine cancer is usually treatable if detected early. If you're experiencing symptoms, contact your VA health care team right away.
